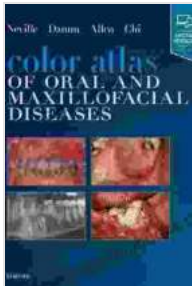

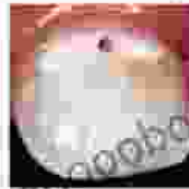

**Grade 1 (B1)**  
White or fissured enamel  
No cavitation clinically



**Grade 2 (B2)**  
Small cavity in enamel



**Grade 3 (B3)**  
Moderate-sized cavity in enamel with exposed dentin (verified by probing)



**Grade 4 (B4)**  
Large cavity in enamel and moderate cavity in dentin



**Grade 5 (B5)**  
Extensive cavity in enamel and substantial loss of dentin

*Occlusal cavities (clinical and radiographic recordings)*



**Grade 1 (O1)**  
White or brown discoloration in enamel  
No clinical cavitation  
No radiographic evidence of caries



**Grade 2 (O2)**  
Small cavities, fissures, or discolorations of the fissure with surrounding gray/opaque enamel and/or radiolucency in enamel as radiograph



**Grade 3 (O3)**  
Moderate sized cavity and/or radiolucency in the outer third of dentin



**Grade 4 (O4)**  
Big cavity and/or radiolucency in the middle third of dentin



**Grade 5 (O5)**  
Big cavity and/or radiolucency in the inner third of dentin

*Approximal cavities (radiographic recordings)*



**Grade 1 (A1)**  
Radiolucency in outer half of enamel



**Grade 2 (A2)**  
Radiolucency in inner half of enamel



**Grade 3 (A3)**  
Radiolucency in the outer third of dentin

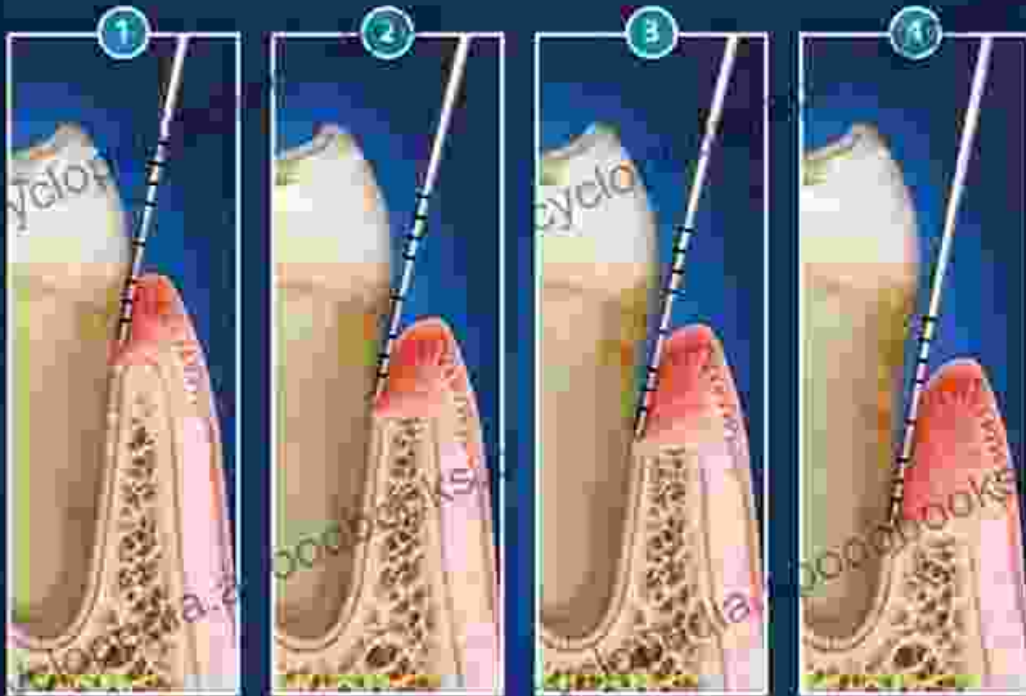


**Grade 4 (A4)**  
Radiolucency in the middle third of dentin



**Grade 5 (A5)**  
Radiolucency in the inner third of dentin

# Stages of Periodontal Disease



## Gingivitis

The most common and earliest form of periodontal disease is gingivitis. The gingiva is the pink tissue that surrounds the teeth and is commonly referred to as "gum tissue." Hence, if the gingiva is inflamed, the term gingivitis is used. Inflammation is caused by bacterial plaque (biofilm) accumulation in the absence of effective daily oral hygiene. This results in a change of color from the tissue's natural pink to various shades of red. The affected area will usually become swollen and bleed when touched or probed. Pockets in excess of or 2-4 millimeters may form.

## Early or Mild Periodontitis

This stage clinically appears the same as gingivitis with redness, bleeding on probing, and gum swelling. What distinguishes periodontitis ("peri" = around; "donti" = root; "itis" = inflammation) from gingivitis is bone loss. Once the inflammation extends from the gingiva to the bone tissue and begins causing bone loss, this condition is referred to as periodontitis. Here the pockets (depth) usually increase to approximately 4-6 millimeters.

## Moderate Periodontitis

As the disease progresses from mild to moderate, inflammation and infection extend deeper into the tissues — resulting in 20-50% bone loss from around the tooth's root. Pocket depth may increase to 4-8 millimeters. Symptoms such as bleeding, swelling and redness will remain and pus may be visible. Smoking cigarettes\* will mask some of these signs and worsen the condition.

## Advanced Periodontitis

When bone loss is severe, representing a loss of 50-95% of bone support from the tooth root, teeth become very loose and uncomfortable during functional movements (chewing). Pocket depths may range from 7-12 millimeters. Signs and symptoms will remain, such as bleeding, swelling, redness, and probably pus which is masked by the smoking of cigarettes,\* which will worsen the condition.

\* Cigarettes reduce blood flow and often hide the signs of periodontal disease.

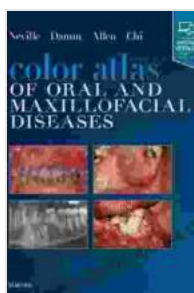

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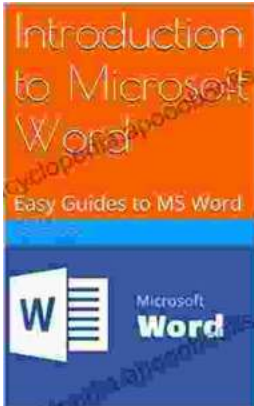
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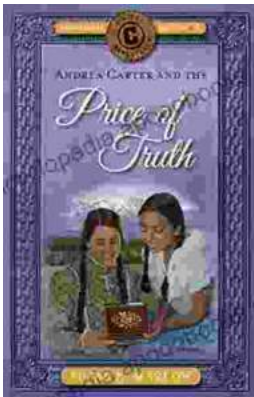
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
