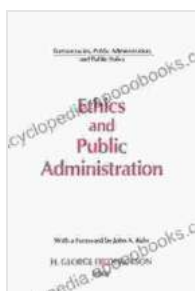


Appendix C: Ethical Decision Making Model Flowchart

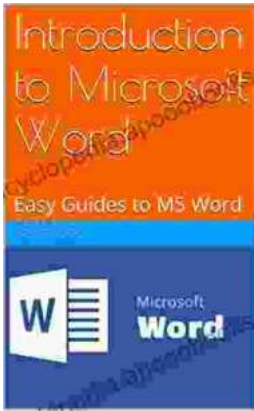

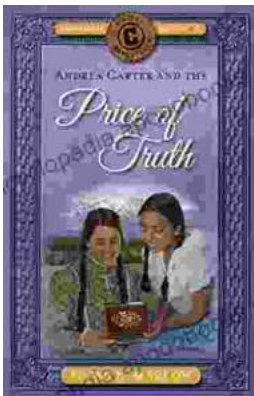
